

NYAMIRA COUNTY FINANCE BILL 2023/2024

A Bill of Nyamira County Government to provide for the imposition or variation of fees, charges, licenses, rents or rates for services pursuant to Article 209 and 210 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 and for connected purposes.

SECTION 1: PRELIMINARY

Short title and commencement

1. This Bill may be cited as the Nyamira County Finance Bill, 2022 and shall come into operation after the Governor assents to it and published in the Gazette.

Interpretation

2. In this Act unless context otherwise requires

“Authorized Channel” means the manner in which a person may effect payment to the County Government, including but not limited to a person designated by the Executive Committee Member pursuant to Section 157 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, to collect, receive revenue or any other mode of payment as may be prescribed.

“Barriers” refers to all roads blocks designated by the County Government for purposes of collecting all cesses, tea hawking and any other approved levies, and shall include Egesieri, Township, Kebirigo, Nyamaiya, Miruka, Sironga, Ekerenyo, Kioge, Magwagwa, Ikonge, Nyaututu, Ibencho, Bonyunyu, Itibo, Chepilat, Matutu, Nyansiongo, Manga Scheme, Mokomoni, Nyaramba, Tindereti, Chepngombe, Metamaywa, Gesero, Akamba, Gesima, Rigoma, Nyabarainye, Nyangori, Magombo, Tombe, Kemera, Manga, Motemomwamu, Moromba, Kiendege, Mosobeti and any other that may be introduced from time to time.

“Cess” means fees chargeable on goods under *SECTION 7: SCHEDULES* of Nyamira County Finance Bill;

“County Government” means the Government of Nyamira.

“County Public Officer” means a county public officer within the meaning of Section 2 of the County Governments Act, 2012;

“County Receiver of Revenue” means a person designated pursuant to Section 157 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 and Section 4 of the Nyamira County Revenue Administration Act, 2018;

“County Revenue Collector” means a county public officer authorized to collect revenue pursuant to Section 158 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012;

“County” means Nyamira County.

“Digital Clamping” refers to the digital clamping of parking fees defaulting vehicles using the digital platform in use by the county Government. Parking Customers will be notified digitally before digital clamping is done.

“Digital Payment” refers to all digital formats of County Fees payments including mpesa, digital transfers, EFTs, etc.

“Executive Committee Member” means the County Executive Committee Member for the time being responsible for matters relating to finance in the County Government;

“Major Urban Zones” includes Manga Town, Nyansiongo Town, Nyamira Municipality, Ikonge Ekerenyo, and Keroka Town.

“Nyamira Municipality” include Nyamira Township, Kioge, Miruka, Konate, Nyamaiya, Kebirigo, Sironga, Nyaramba & Tinga.

“Permit” means an original permit issued under this Bill; **“Person”** means a natural or juristic person.

“Revenue Collection Points”, refers to all areas designated by the county for collection of county revenues and shall include all market centers, all premises

carrying out authorized business activities, agricultural zones, parking areas, financial institutions, private practitioners, barriers, Quarries, etc.

“Sub-County Revenue Officer” means officer in charge of mobilization and collection at the sub- County.

“Tax or Fee” shall refer to compulsory financial contribution imposed by the county. **“Time”** means the time range between which a collector or any other authorized person shall collect the county levies. And in this case collection of the said levies shall be 24 hours all days.

“Towing” refers to the physical movement of a clamped vehicle after a duration of 2 hours (or any vehicle in breach of the County Laws and Regulations) to the designated vehicle impounding yard

“Treasury” means the County Treasury of Nyamira.

“Vehicle Impounding Yard” refers to designated areas by County Government for purposes of keeping safe all impounded items. These area shall include the impounding yard next to the revenue office, sub county revenue offices, and any other area so designated.

“Zone A” shall include the County Municipalities including Nyamira Municipality, Keroka Town & Nyansiongo Town.

“Zone B” shall Include Kemera, Omogonchoro, Chepilat, Ikonge, Magombo, Mosobeti, Manga, Gesima, Nyamusi, Tombe, Kemera, Girango, Magwagwa, Mokomoni, Kapsuser, Nyabara Ibere.

“Zone C” shall include all other areas not mentioned in Zone A & B.

SECTION 2: FEES, CHARGES, LICENCES, RENT, CESS AND RATES

Lands, Housing,
Physical Planning,
Surveying and Urban
Development fees

Interpretation

Advertisement

Market Fees

1. The County Government shall offer the services specified in part 7 of the third schedule upon receipt of payment of the fee prescribed in the last column of that Schedule. In addition, the county government shall impose such fees as specified in part 1 of the first schedule.
2. A person who wishes to construct a building or structure in the Manner specified in the third Schedule shall apply for a Development Permission & Approvals to the County Department responsible for physical planning
3. A person who commits an offence under this Act for which no penalty is provided shall be liable, on conviction to a fine not exceeding Kenya Shillings Two hundred thousand (KShs. 200,000) or an imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or both
4. A person occupying a plot, stall or a building leased or rented out by the County Government shall pay rent at the rate Specified in the last column of the relevant parts of the third Schedule
5. The rent referred to under subsection (4) shall be due in case of
 - a. a plot, on the 1 day of January of each year;
 - b. house or stall on the first day of each month
6. A penalty of Five percent (5%) compounded per month shall be charged on the outstanding rent on premises.
7. The County Government may evict a person who is in rent arrears exceeding three months.
8. The County Government may repossess the plot referred to under subsection (4) if the person fails to pay the rent after the 31 day of March.
9. A person who wishes to display advertisements and signage in the manner specified in part 7 of the third Schedule shall apply for a permit to the County Government Department responsible for Physical Planning.
10. A person who wishes to advertise in the manner specified in Part 7 of the third Schedule shall apply for a permit to the County Government Department responsible for Physical Planning.
11. The Department of Physical Planning may grant the necessary Permit referred to under subsection (2) upon payment of the fees prescribed in the third Schedule.
12. A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section Commits an offence and shall be subjected to fines as prescribed under the sixth schedule.
13. There shall be a fee for access of markets or stalls for the sale of goods, foods, animals or products as specified in Part 1 of the fourth schedule
14. A person shall not carry out, within Nyamira County, any business or services specified in the second schedule without valid license issued by the relevant county office.
15. A person who intends to carry out any of the business listed in the second schedule shall apply for a license or permit from any of the county offices or such other designated agents as shall be prescribed by the County Government from time to time

16. A person who applies for license under subsection (3) shall be issued with a license on the payment of the applicable fee, depending on the location and size of the business as specified in the amended second schedule.
17. Licenses/ permits issued under subsection (4) must be visibly displayed at the business premise at all times.
18. A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence as prescribed in the sixth schedule.
- Cess
19. Cess or market fees shall be charged on the goods specified in the first column of the fifth schedules at the amended rate specified.
20. A person who fails to pay the cess or market fees set under subsection (1) commits an offence.
21. The County Executive Committee Member may by order published in the Gazette waive or vary any fees or charges payable under this Act in accordance to the criteria developed under section 159 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012.
22. The County Executive Committee member responsible for finance may by order published in the Kenya Gazette amend any of the schedules.
23. Any order made under sub-section (4) shall be laid before the County Assembly without unreasonable delay, and unless a resolution approving the order is passed by the County Assembly within twenty one days when the assembly next sits after the order is so laid, the order shall lapse, but without prejudice to anything previously done there under.
- Hire of county vehicles and machinery
24. A person shall not use County Government machinery without the relevant authority from the County Government.
25. A person who wishes to use County Government machinery shall apply to the relevant department within the County Government.
26. The relevant County Government department may grant the application under subsection (2) upon the payment of the fee Specified in the last column of Part 5 of the third schedule
27. A person who contravenes the provision of this section commits an offence.
28. A person shall not use County Stadia, grounds or hall specified In Part 10 of the third schedule without authority from the County Government.
- Fees for County Stadiums or Halls
29. A person who wishes to use County Stadia, ground or hall specified in sub- section (1) shall apply for a permit to the relevant County Government department.
30. The relevant County Government department may grant the Permit referred to in subsection (2) upon payment of fees prescribed in the last column of the relevant part of that Schedule.
31. A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section Commits an offence and is liable for fines as outlined in schedule six.
- Food Hygiene
32. A person shall not sell products, operate a business or receive the services specified in Part 4 of the third Schedule without a permit from the County Government
33. A person who wishes to sell foods or drugs or receive the County Government services specified in the Seventh schedule shall apply for a permit from the relevant County Government Department.

- Livestock and veterinary services fees
34. The relevant County Department may grant the permit or Provide the services specified in the Schedule upon payment of the fee specified in that schedule.
35. A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.
36. person shall not carry out any business or provide the services specified in Part 1 of the third Schedule Without the authority from the County Government
37. A person who wishes to carry out a business or provide the Services specified in part 1of the third schedule shall apply for a permit or certificate to the relevant County Government Department.
38. The relevant County Government Department may grant the Permit under subsection (2) upon payment of fees prescribed in that schedule.
39. A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.
- Medical and Public Health services
40. A person who receives medical or health services from health centers in the County shall be charged the fee specified in the last column of part 3 of the third Schedule;
41. The fees applicable to sub section (1) shall not be levied for victims of rape when filing a P3 form in a County medical facility.”
- Infrastructure Maintenance Fee
42. A person who operates a quarry or transports quarry products, red soil, manure, white clay soil and others from, into or through the County shall pay the fee specified in Part 2 of the third Schedule.
43. A person transporting agricultural products from, into or through the County shall be charged the fee specified in Part, 4and 5 of the third Schedule for the maintenance of infrastructure.
44. A person who contravenes provisions of this section shall be guilty of offence.
- A person who contravenes provisions of this section shall be guilty of offence.
45. The Executive Committee Member may exempt, waive or vary fees or charges payable under this Act in accordance to the criteria prescribed under section 159 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012
- Amendments to The schedules
46. The Executive Committee Member may by order published in the Gazette amend any of the Schedules to this Act.
47. An order made under subsection (1) shall be laid before the County Assembly without unreasonable delay, and unless a resolution approving the order is passed by the County Assembly within the next twenty-one days on which it next sits after the order is so laid, the order shall lapse, but without prejudice to anything previously done there under.

SECTION 3: PAYMENTS

Payments to the County Government

1. All payments to the County Government shall be made through an authorized channel.
2. A County Government Revenue Collector or authorized officer shall in the exercise of any functions under this part identify himself or herself by visibly displaying an identification card issued by County Government
3. A County official receipt shall be issued for all payments made to the county government.
4. Every person who makes payment through an authorized channel shall demand an official receipt for each such payment and every payment made through an authorized channel shall be evidenced by an official receipt.
5. A person shall not receive or collect any money on behalf of The County Government unless authorized in writing by the Executive committee member in charge of finance
6. A person who contravenes the provisions of this section Commits an offence

Appointment and Duties of an Agent

7.
 - a) In this section– "Agent" means a person appointed as such under part 1 of Revenue Administration Act, 2018 "a notice" means a notice issued by the Executive Committee Member appointing an agent.
 - b) The Executive Committee Member may by written notice addressed to any person:-
 - i. appoint him or her to be an agent of the County Government for the purposes of collection or recovery of charges, permit fees, license fees, rent, cess and such other fees, as may be necessary for carrying out the purposes of this Act;
 - ii. Specify the amount of charges, permit fees, license fees, rent, cess and such other fees to be collected or recovered by the agent
 - c) An agent appointed under this section shall ensure due compliance with the provisions of this Act and remit all revenue collected to the county receiver of revenue or as may be otherwise instructed in the appointment notice.
 - d) Where an agent claims to be, or to have become unable to comply with subsection -2, he or she shall, within seven working days, notify the Executive Committee Member in writing, setting out fully the reasons for his inability to comply, and the Executive Committee Member shall accept the notification and cancel or amend the appointment notice accordingly.
 - e) Where an agent fails to issue a notice to the Executive Committee Member under subsection -4, sufficient moneys for the payment of charges, permit fees, license fees, rent, cess and such other fees specified in the agent's appointment notice shall be presumed to be held by him and this money shall be due and payable to the County Government.
 - f) For the purpose of this section, the Executive Committee Member

may, by notice in writing, at any time, require any person to furnish him or her, within reasonable time not being less than seven days from the date of service of the notice, with information showing any moneys which may be held by the agent for, or due by him to the County Government.

- g) Where an agent fails to pay an amount of money collected under this section within the time specified in the notice, the provisions of this Act relating to the collection and recovery of revenue shall apply to the collection and recovery of that amount as if it were revenue due and payable by the agent, the due date for the payment of which was the date upon which that amount should have been paid to the County Government under this subsection.
- h) An agent who makes a payment to the County Government under this section shall for all purposes be deemed to have acted under the authority of the County Government and shall be indemnified in respect of that payment against all proceedings, civil or criminal, and all processes, judicial or extra judicial, notwithstanding any provisions to the contrary in any written law, contractor agreement.

SECTION 5: OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

Penalties to permit holders and licensees

In addition to the offences under this bill, if the person without lawful authority-

1. Operates a business within the County without a valid business license or permit.
2. Erects, fixing, placing, maintaining, displaying or using or permitting to be erected, fixed, placed, maintained displaying or used, any advertisement or advertising device without a permit or otherwise than in accordance with the terms and conditions of a permit.
3. Operates outside the designated trading area or premises.
4. Defaces any building by writing, signs, or other marks.
5. Cuts or permits to be cut a tree in any property (whether private or public) without a permit issued by the County.
6. Loiters on any County property other than a street or residential property, without lawful authority.
7. Drives or permits to be driven any vehicle so loaded that its contents or any part thereof spill onto the surface of a street shall be guilty of an offence.
8. Discharges a missile in a manner likely to cause damage to property or danger to any person.
9. Participates in or authorizing the breaking up of the surface of a public street.
10. Deposits or causes or permits to be deposited any soil, vegetation, refuse or debris on any land in the County.
11. Being in connection with any building, demolition or road construction work, cause or suffer to be caused any unnecessary noise so loud or to continuously or repeated as to cause an annoyance to occupants of any premises in the neighborhoods.

Offences

12. Being in any part of the town other than the industrial or light industrial zones as specified in any laws of the County for the time being in force, in connection with any trade or industrial process cause or suffer to be caused any noise so loud or so continuous or so repeated as to cause annoyance to the occupants of any premises in the neighborhoods;
13. Intentionally or recklessly obstructs or hinders a person while that person is acting in performance or exercise of the person's functions or powers under this Act;
14. Makes any statement or declaration, or gives any information or certificate, lawfully required by or under this Act knowing it to be false or misleading in material or respect;
15. Dwelling the parks or be in the parks beyond the specified times;
16. Fails to pay fees, charges, penalties contrary to the provisions of this Act
17. Fails to keep or display licenses or permits at conspicuous place of business;
18. Transfers business premises license or permit for purposes of undertaking business in non-designated or permitted area;

19. Constructs, or permits the construction of a sewer connection otherwise than in accordance with this Act; or
20. Commits any other offence not covered in this Section but is covered under other sections in this Act. Unless otherwise stated in this Act, any person Who contravenes the provisions of this Act shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five thousand shillings in respect of a first offence and not exceeding seven thousand shillings in respect of a second or subsequent offence, or imprisonment for a period not exceeding seven months in respect of a first offence and not exceeding nine months in respect of a second or subsequent, offence or both

Penalties

21. Unless otherwise stated in this Act, any person who contravenes the provisions of this Act shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five hundred thousand shillings in respect of a first offence and not exceeding seven thousand shillings in respect of a second or subsequent offence, or imprisonment for a period not exceeding seven months in respect of a first offence and not exceeding nine months in respect of a second or subsequent, offence or both.

SECTION 6: MISCELLANEOUS

Savings

1.
 - i. Any fee, charge, licenses, rent or cess payable to the County Government at the commencement of this Act which is not included in any of the schedule to this bill shall continue to be chargeable by and payable to the County Government unless they are repealed by the Act of the County Government or until an Act of the County Government on such a fees, charges, licenses, rent or cess is enacted.
 - ii. All directions, resolutions, orders and authorization on or relating to financial management, including the collection and administration of fees and charges given or issued by the previous municipal Councils, County councils and Town Councils before the commencement of this Act shall be deemed to have been given, issued or made by under the Authority of the county assembly until the expiry or repeal of those directions, resolutions, orders and authorizations, and continue, with the necessary modification, to apply, be paid and administered under this bill.
 - iii. All references to the councils shall include all Local authorities as were defined under the now repealed Local Government Act, Cap 265 of the Laws of Kenya.

Cessation

2. Unless otherwise provided in this bill, the rates for fees, charges, licenses, cess or rent, applicable before the commencement of this bill in respect of any business, activity, goods or service listed in the schedule, shall cease to apply.
3. Unless otherwise provided in this Bill, the rates for fees, charges, licenses, cess or rent are applicable annually/ per annum.

SECTION 7: SCHEDULES

FIRST SCHEDULE: SINGLE BUSINESS PERMIT

The following charges shall be levied on the services listed in first column at rates specified in fifth, sixth and seventh columns as amended.

SECTION 4: OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

General penalty

1. A person who commits an offence under this Bill for which no penalty is provided shall be liable upon conviction to a fine not exceeding two hundred thousand shillings or to an imprisonment term not exceeding one year or both.
2. A person who hinders, obstructs, interferes or prevents an authorized officer, or any other person duly authorized in writing by the Executive Committee Member in exercising the powers under this Act shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine of one hundred thousand shillings or to an imprisonment term not exceeding one year or to both. A
3. A person who refuses to give information or gives false information which may lead to under charging in addition to any other remedy under this Act shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred thousand shillings or to an imprisonment term not exceeding one year or to both.

Offences by staff of the County Government

4. A county Public Officer or any other person having a duty to perform under this Bill who:
 - i. makes in any record, or document required to be kept or made by that person, an entry which he or she knows or has reasonable cause to believe not to be true or to be false;
 - ii. willfully refuses to do anything which he or she knows or has reasonable cause to know is required to be done
 - iii. interferes with any other person or process under this bill, so as to defeat the provisions, requirements or purposes of this Act;
 - iv. where required under this Act to do anything to give effect to the provisions of this Act, fails to do such thing;
 - v. without reasonable cause omits to do something in breach of his or her duty under this Act;
 - vi. willfully contravenes the provisions of this Act to give undue advantage or favor to another person; or
 - vii. fails to prevent or report to the County Government or any other relevant authority, the commission of an offence committed under this Act;
 - viii. Commits an offence and is liable upon conviction, to a fine not exceeding two hundred thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, or both.
